When job hunting,
it is very important to think thoroughly and repeatedly about what you want to do.
Use the "Shuukatsu Jumpstart" website to find out what you really want to do.

STEP 1



Conduct your self-assessment (aka self-analysis)

Answer questions about your childhood and school days to conduct your self-assessment from various perspectives. While answering these questions, reflect on yourself, consider your strengths and weaknesses, what kind of job is right for you, and why.

STEP 2



Write an entry sheet

An "entry sheet" is a document that tells the company you want to enter why you want to join that company and what kind of person you are. Use the results of your self-assessment and the entry sheet examples as a guide to help you convey your ideas effectively.

STEP 3



Rehearse for job interviews

Some paid features

There is always an "interview" in the job-hunting process. Practice for interviews so you can verbally communicate what you wrote in your entry sheet. You can practice two types of interviews: one where you answer set questions, and one where you answer questions created by AI based on your entry sheet (paid feature). The interview practice can be recorded, so you can review it repeatedly to ensure you are clearly expressing your thoughts.

STEP 4



Rehearse for debates

Paid feature

Job interviews include "debates" as part of group discussions. You can discuss various topics with two AI students and practice to express your own opinion while watching the flow of the conversation. Debates can also be recorded, so you can check afterwards whether you were pro-actively participating rather than just answering questions.

STEP 5



Review the files you saved

You can review the saved files of your self-assessment, entry sheets, and videos of interviews and debates at any time. If you provide teacher users registered on the site with your user name, they can correct your entry sheets, comment on your self-assessment, interviews and debate videos, and answer your questions.
